A Simple Outline

The Book of Exodus begins with a dramatic conflict between God and The Ruler of Egypt.

Ex 1: 15:21

Describes a Journey into the Wilderness 15:22-18:27

Concludes with an account of the Covenant at Sinai Chapters 19 - 40

The Mood of the Book of Exodus:

Strife and Resolution

1. **Yahweh Verses Pharaoh (Or Yahweh verses other Gods)**
2. **Yahweh Verses Moses**
3. **Yahweh verses the People who have fled from Oppression**
4. **Moses Verses Aaron (read between the lines!)**
5. **Incredible Power and Conditional Healing**



A reminder... we will be talking about this again! The Pentateuch consists of the first five books of the Hebrew Scriptures: Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, and Deuteronomy

The term "Pentateuch" comes from the Greek term pent teuchos meaning "five-volumed (book) .

The Jews called it "Torah" (instruction) which is often referred to as "Law"

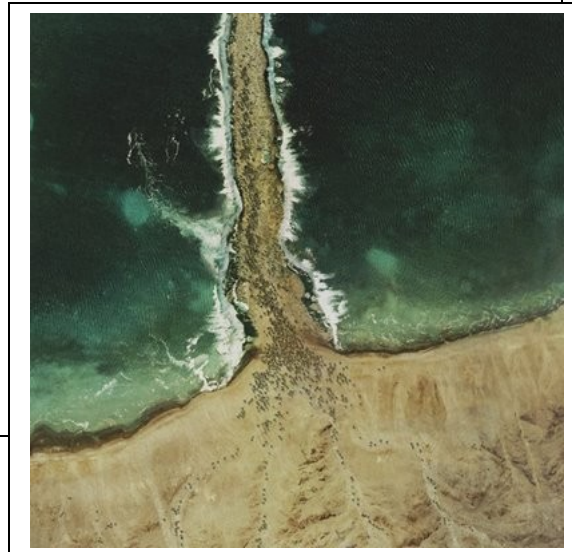
About 3000 years ago the Israelites were enslaved by the Egyptians under the rule of the Pharaoh Ramses II.

Moses, a simple shepherd, was led by God on a powerful Spiritual Journey, and then instructed by Yahweh to go to the pharaoh and demand the freedom of his people.

God began a `Cat and Mouse Game with` Pharaoh. The hardened heart we read about.....

Moses' plea ***let my people go*** was ignored. Moses warned the Pharaoh that would send severe punishments if the Israelites were not freed. Again the Pharaoh ignored Moses' request of freedom. In response Yahweh unleashed a series of 10 terrible plagues on the people of Egypt.

1. Blood
2. Frogs
3. Lice (vermin)
4. Wild Beasts(flies)
5. Blight (Cattle Disease)
6. Boils
7. Hail
8. Locusts
9. Darkness
10. Slaying of the First Born



And so the Wilderness Journey Begins!

Exo 15:21 And Miriam, answering, said, Make a song to the Lord, for he is lifted up in glory; the horse and the horseman he has sent into the sea.

Exo 15:22 Then Moses took Israel forward from the Red Sea, and they went out into the waste land of Shur; and for three days they were in the waste land where there was no water.

Exo 15:23 And when they came to Marah, the water was no good for drinking, for the waters of Marah were bitter, which is why it was named Marah.

Exo 15:24 And the people, crying out against Moses, said, What are we to have for drink?

Exo 15:25 And in answer to his prayer, the Lord made him see a tree, and when he put it into the water, the water was made sweet. There he gave them a law and an order, testing them;

Exo 15:26 And he said, If with all your heart you will give attention to the voice of the Lord your God, and do what is right in his eyes, giving ear to his orders and keeping his laws, I will not put on you any of the diseases which I put on the Egyptians: for I am the Lord your life-giver.
